The Chinook is a New England dog and, therefore is adaptable to any climate in North America. He instinctively guards children, protect homes without training and, their usual life span is 14 to 16 years of age. They are tawny in color, but occasionally some do have a dark overcoat. They weigh between 90 and 110 pounds at maturity.

Chinooks are never shipped, but all prospective owners must come to the Kennel and spend at least twenty-four hours here.

The price is \$350 and up, depending on the individual puppy, as to beauty and intelligence.

The Chinook is a friendly dog, is exceptionally intelligent, very independent and, only care about pleasing their own family or friends of the family. They pay little attention to strangers or to other dogs, but, if attacked, are invincible.

We believe that dogs should be well mannered, should be taught to stay on their own property and to be in homes where they will be loved and respected.
